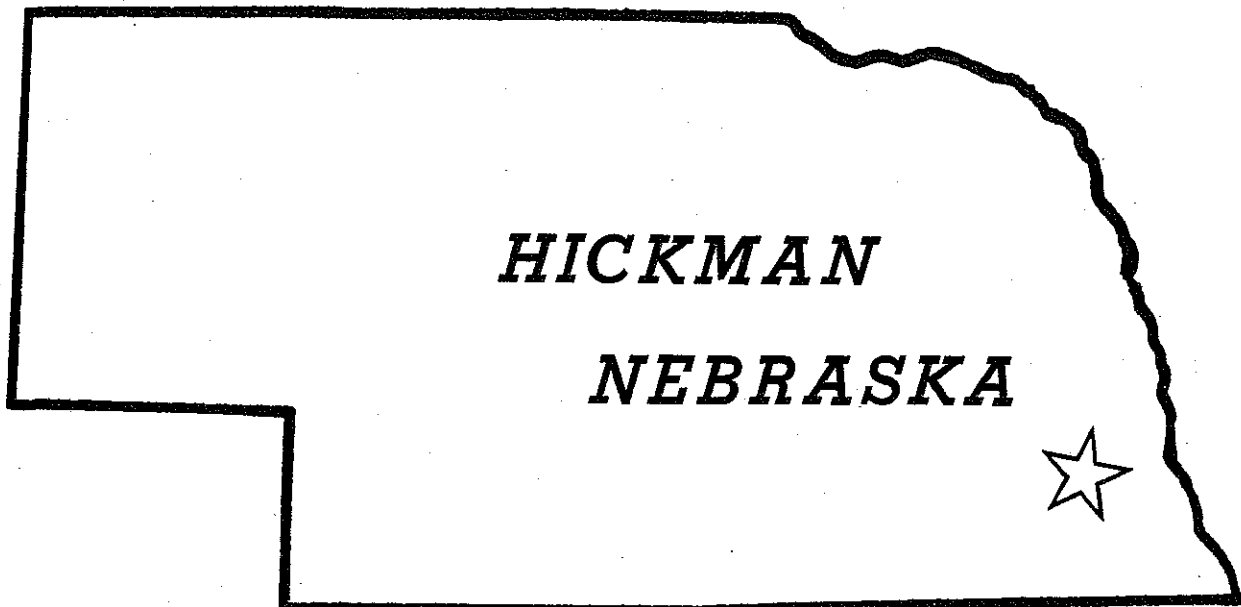

The Committee

This book is dedicated to the Pioneers who braved the many hardships to make Hickman their home and who, by their toil and sweat, and their vision of the future, made Hickman possible. On the pages following the history of Hickman will unfold. This book is being put together to help celebrate our Centennial Year. From numerous sources we have taken this material and it would be impossible to thank everyone who assisted with our "Centennial Edition."

1872: Hickman is a busy business center, located on the Atchison and Nebraska Division of the B. & M., and on the Crete branch of the Missouri Pacific. It is situated on Section 33, Saltillo Precinct. It was laid out by C. H. Heckman et al., and the plot filed on record September 20, 1872. Hickman enjoys a good trade due to the enterprise of its citizens.

The Hickman Enterprise is correctly named, for it is always standing up for Hickman and vicinity. This paper was established in 1886 by a man named Blizzard. It made its first appearance May 1st as an independent paper, and has been continued as such ever since. Mr. Blizzard was succeeded by E. F. Fassett, and he by Cyrus Black. The latter transfer was made June 12, 1893. It is now a six column folio with a circulation of 600.

1866, Hickman, Nebraska: Before 1866 the place where Hickman is now located was prairie land. One of Hickmans early settlers was Rev. C. H. Heckman who owned and lived in the Salt Creek Valley southeast of town.

1868: The first Post Office was south of the present town. Mail was received 4 times a week.

September 19, 1872: Records show Hickman officially became known as Hickman instead of Heckman.

November, 1872: The first building was erected in Hickman.

August 27, 1878: The German Presbyterian Church of Hickman was organized.

November, 1878: A prairie fire was a very dreaded thing in these days. It started near the R.R. tracks and burned all the way to Lincoln. No lives were lost.

July 23, 1885: The town of Hickman was incorporated. Hickman became a station on the new R.R.

April 19, 1891: Hickman opened the doors of the Bank of Hickman.

December 30, 1893: Street lights were installed on most street corners. The marshall made the rounds at dark and lit the lights and then he put them out at 10:00 p.m.

September 1, 1894: Plans are in full swing for the Southern Lancaster Fair held in Hickman Park which includes a good half mile race track.

September 1, 1895: Two large rattlesnakes were discovered as they started thru a bedroom window in a local home.

January 25, 1896: There is not a vacant business place in town.

February 8, 1896: The B & M Depot was robbed.

March 4, 1898: Hickman now has a furniture company located in town.

April 22, 1898: Hickman now can boast of a telephone. You can now talk to Omaha or Lincoln.

February 10, 1899: Oats-25¢, wheat-58¢, corn-28¢, eggs-10¢.

August 8, 1899: The Old Settlers of Lancaster Co. held a picnic here at Hickman.

January, 1900: Records show that 530 marriage licenses were issued during 1899 in Lancaster County.

February 2, 1900: Hickman had a show in town at the school house. It consisted of a graphophone and darky selections.

August 20, 1902: Lightning struck the B & M elevator.

October, 1902: The first automobile to come to town was this month.

February 13, 1903: It has been decided a new brick hall will be built in Hickman on top of the new auditorium being built. The several lodges in Hickman are in need of a good hall.

September 25, 1903: A rural mail route was established outside of Hickman.

May 6, 1904: The directors and president of the Bank of Hickman are talking of erecting a new building with a vault.

July 28, 1905: Articles of incorporation of the Hickman Telephone Co. were filed.

November 16, 1906: The new safe for the new bank arrived from Omaha and was placed in the new vault.

August 9, 1907: A splendid 21 room hotel is for sale in Hickman -- \$3,200.00 and easy terms.

September 6, 1907: A lady who lived two miles southeast of Firth was murdered. What a shock this caused to the community.

July 10, 1908: A terrible flood swept the community. There was no mail from Monday until Thursday because of all the flooding.

March 3, 1909: There were 16 house lots for sale in Hickman. A 1 1/2 story house, nearly new and in fine condition was selling for \$1,800.00.

August 20, 1909: About 3,000 people turned out for the Old Settlers Picnic.

January 21, 1910: The roller skating rink at the auditorium is becoming quite popular.

May 5, 1910: The saloon closed by order of the vote of the people.

August 19, 1910: Hickman census was 478.

July 14, 1911: Many of the wells in town are going dry. Most people who have water are sharing with their neighbors.

December 13, 1912: Articles of Incorporation for the First State Bank were filed with the State Banking Board.

November 13, 1914: Pork Chops-15¢ lb., Round Steak-20¢ lb., Prime Rib Roasts-16¢ lb.

1915: The first 12th grade class that graduated from Hickman High, in 1914 there were only 11 grades in high school, and yet in 1913 and earlier there were only 10 grades in high school.

September 21, 1917: The hitching posts and old wooden awnings have been removed from main street.

May 10, 1918: The town board has ordered a flag-pole to be erected in the center of the square.

August 1, 1919: Dr. H. B. Stapleton has located in Hickman.

October 1, 1920: The electric lights were turned on in Hickman for the first time.

May 6, 1921: Hickman is now working on the first telephone book ever published.

January 26, 1923: The doctor's office was destroyed by fire.

August 22, 1924: The drug store in town is changing hands.

January 22, 1925: The Boy Scouts organized.

May 28, 1926: Two men with an airplane came into town and gave rides for \$1.00 each.

November 20, 1926: The new Hickman school building is to be dedicated and given to the public. The cost of this building is \$32,000.00 with equipment. This building is still standing in Hickman today.

February 24, 1927: The Standard Oil Co. has installed an additional pump and tank at two local filling stations for the distribution of ethyl gasoline.

July 20, 1928: A new motor hearse arrived in town.

August 17, 1928: About 5,000 people attended the Old Settlers Picnic.

May 9, 1930: Repairs are being made on the building formerly operated as a creamery co. It will be used for office space and also for a police court room.

October 21, 1930: Martin VerMaas is putting a miniature golf course in the auditorium.

June 24, 1932: Dr. H. A. Evers recently moved to Hickman. His dental office was located in the Dr. Stapleton building.

February 16, 1934: The Presbyterian parsonage caught on fire and burned to the ground.

April 6, 1934: Plans are in the making for a dam in the Hickman Park which will be stocked with fish.

July 5, 1935: The Hickman Enterprise (the town newspaper) has been printing a paper for fifty years.

August 28, 1936: A new waterworks project has just been completed. A new tower is being constructed and is 95 feet from the ground.

October 9, 1936: Hickman purchased a new fire truck.

January 8, 1937: A fire department was organized and Clyde Lesoing was elected as the new fire chief.

November 26, 1937: Hickman now boasts of a library.

May 29, 1939: A group of people are organizing free movies.

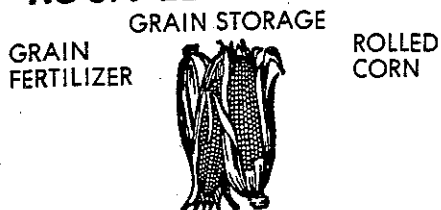
July 28, 1939: A drinking fountain is being installed north of the bank.

January 31, 1941: A going away party was held for 3 local men who were leaving for military service. An organization was formed to continue to provide similar affairs as the demand warrants.

March 24, 1942: The new American Legion Hall was dedicated.

October 9, 1942: The drug store in Hickman has been sold out. Thus taking out a business that has weathered the storms of time for a good many years.

May 7, 1943: A special dedication program was held and a service flag was dedicated. A star appears for all the men from this community who are in the service.

April 6, 1945: There was a break in at the Hickman Motor Company.

March 8, 1946: A barbershop is now open to the public.

June 27, 1947: Hickman received high winds and a severe electrical storm and rain. There was quite a bit of flooding in the area.

July 18, 1947: Delmer DeBoer is now working in the First State Bank.

July 29, 1949: A public auction was held and the Old Settlers dance platform was sold. A cement platform is about to be completed.

May 8, 1950: Another flood hit town. There is no question about this being the worst flood and damage in the history of the area.

June 1, 1951: Orville May has taken over the service station and is still running it today.

March 28, 1952: The last issue of the town newspaper, "The Hickman Enterprise" has just been printed. The editor was Susan Black.

July, 1954: The Boy Scouts cabin was built.

April 1, 1955: The Hickman Cub Scouts were organized.

November, 1958: Ralph Harlan has been elected County Commissioner.

October 23, 1960: Ground Breaking services were held for the United Presbyterian Church building.

1961: The Post Office has moved into its new quarters which originally was the Heckman Feed Store.

August 17, 1962: The newly lighted and renovated athletic field and park were dedicated. Responsible for the project was the Hickman Civic Club.

May, 1964: Mrs. Mabel Nichols retired after teaching in Lancaster County schools for 52 years.

June, 1964: Norris School, Dist. #160 became effective in June with an assessed valuation of \$3,927,705. The new school will be built south of Hickman in the country and it will be a few years before the new building will be ready for school.

November, 1965: Dale Harlan has installed laundromat facilities in a building on main street.

October, 1966: A new barber shop has been built in town. It is owned and operated by Milton Birt.

April, 1967: The Girl Scouts organized three groups.

June 9, 1967: A terrible tornado which gained much newspaper and T.V. publicity hit Hickman on June 9th. Two people were injured and there was lots of property damage.

April, 1968: Don McNeese bought the Hickman Elevator from Union Lumber and Mercantile Co. The elevator is now the Farmer's Feed and Grain Co.

July, 1968: Dorothy and Alvin Huenink bought the Heckman Feed Store from Dwight and Ed Heckman, now known as Huenink Feed Store.

July, 1968: A new Fire Barn began construction and was completed in August.

March, 1969: The Hickman Happy Hour Extension Club put up street signs in town. These street signs were purchased from the sale of the Centennial Book in 1967. A street in town was named "Happy Hour" after the Extension Club.

August, 1969: The Norris Elementary school building was completed and students began their classes at this time.

November, 1969: Dick and Rose Printz purchased the tavern from Dave Yeager. The Printz family formerly from Firth moved to town and began to serve hot meals in the tavern known as "Dick and Rose's Bar and Grill"

January, 1970: The 1970 census taken for the town shows a large increase in population over the 1969 census. Population was 420 with many new homes being built and mobile homes moved into town.

January, 1970: Rev. and Mrs. Ball and family moved to Fremont and Rev. and Mrs. Noel DeKalb and family moved to town to fill the vacancy of the minister.

February, 1970: The Norris Senior High School building was completed and students transferred from the old buildings to resume their classes there.

September, 1970: Work was being started on expanding the Grocery and Locker store owned by Harold Parde. This was completed in July 1971.

July, 1971: Capitol Telephone Co. was sold to Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Co. Virgil VerMaas started in Nov. as their new manager.

July, 1971: Mrs. Mabel Olson was awarded "Good Neighbor" by the Knights of Ak-sar-ben of Omaha. Mabel received her citation during the Old Settlers Picnic by Dale Harlan.

August, 1971: The grain storage bins were moved by the Farmer's Feed and Grain elevator. These bins will store 9,000 bushels each.

August, 1971: Several items of playground equipment have been added to the Public Park and Playground.

December, 1971: A new addition was built on Dick and Rose's Bar and Grill. This is a Steak House with dancing every Friday and Saturday nights.

March, 1972: A new First State Bank building is being built on the corner of 7th and Chestnut Streets.

April, 1972: Work has been started on the east edge of town known as Wagon Train addition to Hickman. At least 40 new homes are to be constructed in this area soon.

The old brick school house was sold and 14 apartments are being built in it.

December, 1972: Extended area phone service will be available to Lincoln from Alvo, Eagle, Cortland, Firth, Hickman, Palmyra areas. This will be the largest toll free areas in the world.

Of Course don't forget the Salt Valley Watershed District which built 2 dams (Wagontrain and Stage Coach) for recreation and flood control for our community now and the future.

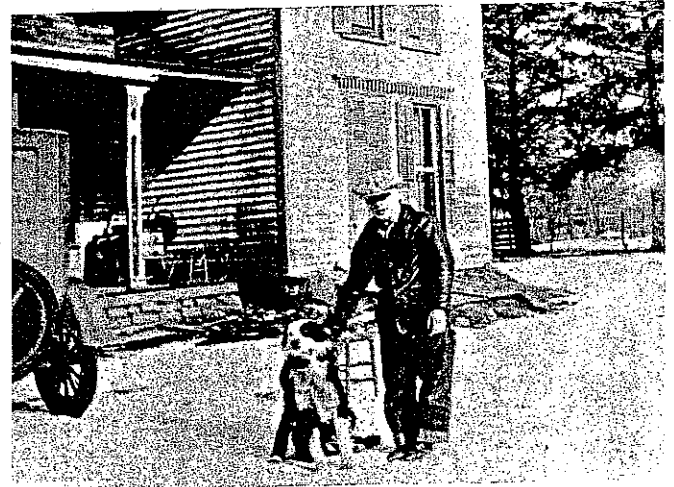
