

Fire Prevention Week October 9-15th, 2022



"Fire Won't Wait Plan Your Escape"

According to the National Fire Protection Agency, this October represents the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week, the nation's longest-running public health observance on record.

- * Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- * Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- * Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- * Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- * Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

Campaign Signs, Posters and Political Advertisements

Zoning Regulations Ordinance No. 2011-14

No campaign signs, posters or political advertisements shall be placed within the street right-of-way. Temporary campaign signs may be placed on private property, positioned as to not obstruct free and clear vision from any driveway, alley, or roadway intersection.

In residential areas, signs cannot exceed ten (10) sq. ft. in area and do not require a permit. In commercial, residential acreage, and industrial areas, signs cannot exceed six (6) feet in height or forty (40) sq. ft. in area and require a temporary sign permit.

Incorrectly placed signs will be removed by City Staff and may be retrieved from the City Office at 115 Locust Street during normal business hours, Monday—Friday 8AM-5PM
