
### Public vs. Private Utility Lines (3rd Edition)

This month we will focus on Electrical Infrastructure ownership (see April 2024 newsletter for sewer ownership information and May 2024 newsletter for drinking water ownership information).

**Electrical Ownership:** Per the City of Hickman's Municipal Code, Chapter 7, Article 4, Hickman is responsible for the electrical distribution system starting at our connection points with Norris Public Power District and running underground throughout the utility easements. The City's ownership includes the primary lines, transformers, junction boxes, pad mount switches, street lights, electrical pedestals, and meters.

The privately owned electrical infrastructure begins at the electrical pedestal where the home or business owners' service line connects to the City's meter. The service line is the electrical wire that connects your breaker box to the electrical meter. The electrical meters are primarily located in the rear yard utility easements, however there are a few properties where the meter is located on the house or structure.

Typical Electrical Ownership for Residential and Business Property



**Other Configuration:** If your electrical meter is on your house or business, then the City owns all infrastructure up to and including the meter.
