NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

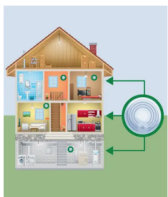

According to the National Fire Protection Agency, this year's FPW campaign, is "Smoke Alarms: Make them work for you!™".

- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or stop responding when tested.
- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

Zoning Regulations Ordinance No. 2023-11

Political Campaign Signs

Such signs shall be placed on private property and not within any right-of-way, and are subject to the following regulations:

1. Residential Districts: Temporary signs six square feet in area or less, located within the property line and do not obstruct traffic.
2. Corridor Overlay, Commercial and Industrial Districts: Temporary signs, located in the City limits, must be less than nine square feet in area. Temporary signs, located in the extraterritorial jurisdiction may be over nine square feet but under 32 square feet in area and do not obstruct traffic.
3. All Political Campaign Signs shall be removed within seven days from the completion of any election date.

City Council Meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month at 7 PM at City Hall. These meetings are open to the public and the public is encouraged to attend. Agendas are posted the Friday prior to the meeting at City Hall, Hickman Post Office, U-Stop and City Website.
