



-unresponsive

-heart malfunctions, blood circulation stops -loss of consciousness, breathing ceases -death occurs in minutes without help



-often alert & responsive, heart continues to circulate blood -pain/pressure/squeezing in chest, neck, arm, or jaw -difficulty breathing, nausea, and profuse sweating present -impending sense of doom

-caused by obstruction of blood flow in the arteries of the heart

NOTE: CARDIAC ARREST CAN FOLLOW A HEART ATTACK OR HAPPEN WHILE SOMEONE IS RECOVERING FROM ONE.

SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST (SCA) IS AFFECTING OVER 356,000 PEOPLE EACH YEAR, INCLUDING 7,000 YOUTH UNDER AGE 18.


Survival depends on the quick actions of people nearby calling 911, starting CPR and using an AED, if



You can triple a person's chance of survival from SCA by starting CPR immediately.

Push hard and fast in the center of the chest, 100 to 120 compressions per minute.

Today only 1 in 10 survives SCA. But with immediate CPR and use of an AED, 5 in 10 victims could survive



Every second counts! not get help right away



AEDs are meant for anyone to use. Follow the step-by-step audio/visual instructions and remember that an AED cannot hurt the person, it can only help.
