Did you know?

- September 19, 1872 Records show Hickman officially became known as Hickman instead of Heckman because of a misspelling in the records office.
- November, 1872 The first building was erected in Hickman.
- April 22, 1898 Hickman had a telephone installed and they were able to call Lincoln and Omaha.
- December 30, 1893 Street lights were installed on most street corners.
- August 19, 1910 Hickman's census was 478.
- October 1, 1920 Electric lights were turned on in Hickman for the first time.
- July 5, 1935 The Hickman Enterprise (the town newspaper) was printing for 50 years.
- March 24, 1942 The new American Legion Hall was dedicated.
- June, 1964 Norris School District #160 became effective and was built in 1969.
- September, 1970 Work was started on expanding the Grocery and Locker store owned by Harold Parde and was completed in July, 1971.
- March, 1972 The First State Bank building was being built at 7th and Chestnut.
